

Bruce J. Hillman, MD, FACR

Dr. Bruce J. Hillman was born and raised in Miami Beach. He graduated Princeton University in 1965 and the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry in 1973. He received his radiology training at Harvard's Peter Bent Brigham Hospital.

Over his forty-five-year career in academic medicine, he served his patients, institutions, and colleagues in a diverse sequence of roles, as a: urologic radiologist (1978–1991), Hartford Foundation Scholar in biomedical research (1981–1983), Pew Foundation Fellow in health services research and policy at the RAND Corporation (1984– 1985), Editor-in-Chief of *Investigative Radiology* and later *Academic Radiology* (1989-1997), Chair of the Department of Radiology at the University of Virginia (1992–2003), President of the University of Virginia physician practice plan (1999–2003), Founding Principal Investigator and Chair of the National Cancer Institute-funded clinical trials cooperative group, the American College of Radiology Imaging Network (ACRIN)(1999–2007), and Founding Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of the American College of Radiology* (2003–2018).

Dr. Hillman is the author or co-author of more than 400 original investigations, editorials and review articles. A sought-after speaker, he has delivered more than 600 lectures around the world. He is the recipient of gold medals and/or other lifetime achievement awards from the ACR, AUR, SUR, RSNA, RASHR, and RLI, has served as president of five radiology societies, and is an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Radiology, the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Radiology, and the French Society of Radiology.

He currently is both Professor Emeritus of Radiology at the University of Virginia and Adjunct Professor of Radiology at Duke University, where he is an Associate of the Trent Center for Biomedical Ethics, Humanities, and the History of Medicine.
