Lung Screening Saves Lives

Do you qualify for a lung cancer screening?



- Are you 50-80 years old?
- Do you currently smoke or have quit in the last 15 years?
- Have you smoked at least 20 pack-years?*

***What are pack-years?** Multiply the number of packs smoked per day by the number of years smoked to calculate your pack-years.



Screening Steps

- Screen for early lung cancer with low-dose CT scan.
- Exams take about 15 minutes.
- No needles or dyes.
- Usually covered by insurance with no copay.
